



COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT

- The situation of covid-19 spread and containment still remains the same. The number keeps on increasing.
- As at yesterday, 2nd July, 2020, Sierra Leone recorded:
- 20 new cases
- confirmed 1518 covid-19 cases curve is on the increase everyday in the country
- Recovery is also on the increase 1007 so far
- admission is on the increase 451 in Covid-19 treatment centers
- deaths from covid-19 is increasing but slowly -60

COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT

- ❑ NO CONFIRMED CASE AROUND LUN SAR.
- ❑ THE EPICENTRE FOR COVID-19 IS FREETOWN, CAPITAL CITY
- ❑ OUR HOSPITAL & CLINIC REMAINS OPEN
- ❑ THE NURSING SCHOOL IS OFFICIALLY CLOSED
- ❑ PATIENTS ATTENDANCE IN OUR TWO CENTRES IS STILL FAR BELOW EXPECTED LESS THAN 50% OF THE EXPECTED ATTANDNACE PER DAY.

COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT

- WE HAVE 154 STUDENTS ON TRAINING BUT CURRENTLY ON PROLONGED STAY AT HOME
- ALL STAFF AND FAMILIES OF STAFF ARE DOING FINE. NO INFECTION AND SUSPECTS AMONGST STAFF AND FAMILY YET.

EFFECT OF COVID-19 ON NURSING EDUCATION

- ❑ Covid-19 epidemic index case in Sierra Leone declared March 31.
- ❑ Sporadic spread reach Freetown
- ❑ April 5, Memo from MOHS to close all Nursing Schools
- ❑ Students were withdrawn from clinical and asked to go home until further notice
- ❑ No formal contact with any student during this period

Effect on Teachers

- Our Staff were not engaged this time as in the ebola
- Nurse educators were not seen in hospital setting helping due to enormous fear
- Nurse educators were asking about the use of on line learning


Effects on Students

- ❑ Students lost a year of academic progression
- ❑ The high risk of students getting themselves infected in hospitals so sent home.
- ❑ Students had little clinical experience
- ❑ Financial burden on students to get data for internet
- ❑ Students were very anxious to access educational materials from staff
- ❑ Students might be forced to provide their own PPE for self safety

Effects on School

- ❑ Increase in demand for more effective student supervision and monitoring
- ❑ Challenge of posting students to hospitals for clinicals. Hospitals might ask school to provide PPEs for students
- ❑ Adherence to safety protocols by students and risk of contamination amongst students
- ❑ Challenge of collecting school charges from students

- ❑ 1 STUDENT VERY ILL FROM OTHER ILLNESS -3RD YEAR
- ❑ STAFF QUARTERS HAVE BEEN ELECTRIFIED WITH SOLAR
- ❑ STAFF SALARY CUT DOWN TO 50% AND NO SALARY FROM JULY 2020 UNTIL SCHOOLS START AGAIN
- ❑ 1ST & 2ND SEMESTER RESULTS PUBLISHED YEAR 1 & 2
- ❑ REFERENCE TO BE TAKEN FROM 13-17 JULY

WHAT HAS HAPPENED DURING THE COVID-19

- ❑ 3RD YEAR STUDENTS RE-CALLED TO TAKE END OF 5TH SEMESTER EXAMS
- ❑ SECONDNMENT OF 1 GERMAN NURSE VOLUNTEER TO THE SCHOOL FOR 3 YEARS TO START FROM JULY 15,2020
- ❑ GRADUATION SUSPENDED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE
- ❑ DRILLING A NEW BORE HOLE 85 METER FOR WATER PROVISION
- ❑ REPLACEMENT OF OLD BEDS AND MATTRESSES IN THE HOSTELS
